Letter from the Pastor-Kevin Young, C.L.P.

Amidst the red and pink fog of Valentine's Day, it's easy to get confused about true love. We will go far off course if we let our culture define "love" for us. Consider the fact that millions of theatergoers are eagerly awaiting the premiere of the film "Fifty Shades of Grey." The movie is about a wealthy and handsome man who manipulates an innocent young woman into gratifying his desire to inflict pain. And Hollywood is marketing this as a love story?

What a contrast to biblical teaching! The apostle John writes, "In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins" (1 John 4:10). Christ did not come to inflict pain on us (which we deserved); instead He took the pain upon Himself so that we might be spared. Now that is a love story! And this is the true love for which so many people yearn, without knowing how to find it.

Tragically, they too often settle for false substitutes. They identify love with desire and attachment, even when the attachment is damaging to those involved.

The nature of marital love, in particular, is up for debate in our society. The Supreme Court recently announced that it will rule on whether the traditional definition of marriage, as the lifelong union of one man and one woman, violates the U.S. Constitution. The court will hear oral arguments in April and deliver its decision in June.

We Christians need to be ready to speak our piece in the discussions that are sure to arise around those dates. We need to know what the Scriptures teach and what we believe about marriage, and be able to explain why. We must be prepared to give our answer not only in secular society, but also inside the church.

Local presbyteries in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) are currently voting on a *Book of Order* amendment that would redefine marriage from "a man and a woman" to any "two persons." Pastor friends in more conservative denominations tell me they receive inquiries from prospective members about their position on same-sex relationships. They are put on the spot to give an answer.

Do we have an answer? I believe we do, it's not just a "no" to same-sex relations or cohabitation or any of the other substitutes that our society accepts. It is a "yes" to marriage as God intended it, the mystery of the two created sexes becoming "one flesh" in total, unconditional self-giving love and devotion. In the covenant of marriage we see an image of the love that God has for his people, a love that reaches across the great divide to claim us as His own, and never lets go. We also know the earthly blessings that marital love can bring.

Abundant social science research shows that both adults and children are, on average, happiest and healthiest when they live in a household constituted by the lifelong union of one man and one woman.

See! God's design really is best for us after all!
